

# VALE Hank (Harold) Cosgrove, 20/02/1932 - 18/05/2019



The Australia Papua New Guinea Association extends its deepest condolences to the family and friends of Hank Cosgrove. Hank was a driving force behind many endeavours, with his passion for life and sense of adventure making him a well-liked and respected figure in many communities.

Hank was a life member of the Association taking on many committee member and President roles, which he enjoyed and thrived in because of his long affiliation with PNG where he worked for 18 years in Lae for the Department of Works. It was during his time in PNG that he met his wife, Berry and had two children, Stuart and Beverley. In his eulogy to his father, Stuart said that the time spent in PNG was some of the best times he can recall.

"Dad was very funny at times, he was also extremely knowledgable about most things and was one of the best story-tellers in the world. He instilled a lot of important life skills in me that I continue to follow today." Hank was a local icon and an inspiration to many, and his legacy lives on through the connections he made with those fortunate enough to cross his path.



### AGM - Guest speaker, Mr Geoff Scahill

#### Who are Abt Associates?

**Geoff:** Abt Associates' forerunner in Australia, JTA International, was founded in PNG with the then CEO, Jane Thomason winning an Australian aid funded health sector project in 1999. Today, we are known as Abt Associates where PNG represents over 60% of our work. In PNG, Abt Associates has over 430 employees, 80% are Papua New Guineans – and work in the health and education sectors, with our largest portfolio being the Australia PNG Governance Partnerships a number of private sector clients.

#### What is donor funding?

**Geoff:** Donor funding or Official Development Assistance (ODA) is defined by OECD as *government aid designed to promote the economic development and welfare of developing countries*. Australia spends 0.232% of gross national income on aid, well below the target set by the United Nations of 0.7% of gross national income for developed countries.

#### What was Australia's contribution to ODA this year?

**Geoff:** Australia's ODA to PNG in the 2018-19 financial year was \$578 million, increasing to an estimated \$607.5 million this financial year – representing 15% of Australia's total ODA budget. In PNG, more than 80% of Australian Government Fundingis managed by the Australian Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade (DFAT). PNG's aid funding has been concentrated from Australia – we have been PNG's largest donor, with Australia contributing over 70% of PNG's aid and development funds from OECD countries.

#### What are the focus areas of that funding?

**Geoff:** The focus is on social (health, immunisation, border protection), trade (\$6 billion 2-way trade) and development assistance targeted at:

- promoting effective governance
- enabling economic growth and
- enhancing human development.

Abt Associates is committed to being part of the thinking and delivery to support Papua New Guinea's growth and we hope to continue to develop strong relationships.

## **PNG High Commissioner visit**



Mr John Kali, CMG OBE, High Commissioner for Papua New Guinea, based in

Canberra recently visited Brisbane.

Mr Jimmy Ovia, Brisbane Acting Consul General hosted a small reception to welcome the High Commissioner and also took the opportunity to officially open the new <u>Brisbane Consulate offices</u>, located at 316 Adelaide Street.

Mr Kali gave a short speech acknowledging the strong relationship between PNG and Australia, the role of the Consulates and the new Prime Minister James Marape's vision for PNG going forward. ## Laukautim Mama Yu



As part of the Association's donation program for PNG projects, we were approached by <u>Soroptimist International</u> (SI). SI were in the process of getting printed 1,000 new obstetric wheels for PNG doctors, midwives and medical staff.

An obstetric wheel is used by doctors and health professionals to calculate when a mother became pregnant and estimates when the child delivery date is due. This information is important to make sure the mother attends regular prenatal clinics, and also to time a supervised delivery by a experienced midwife or doctor, especially if the birth is likely to have complications.

Infant mortality is still very high with 53.4 deaths per 1,000 live births in 2017. We hope that this small donation can help to reduce infant and mother mortality in PNG. The wheels are being distributed by SI to all PNG Provinces health staff.

## Business breakfast: The Sepik Development Project - a nation building pathway for Frieda River



On September 18, we were privileged to have Scott Cowie, Pan Aust General Manager Technical services present at a business breakfast that attracted over 120 members and guests. Scott provided a comprehensive overview of the <u>complex project</u> that comprises four components including:

- the Frieda River Copper-Gold mining operations
- Frieda River Hydroelectric Project that is also the waste rock and tailings storage facility
- Sepik Power Grid Project and
- Sepik Infrastructure Project.

The project will be a potential game changer for the region with a long mine life and Hydroelectric Dam with 100-year life. PanAust have submitted an EIS and this is currently under review by PNG and Sepik governments. Timing for gaining all approvals and community consent is likely to take a number of years. PanAust have said they are committed to getting it right, rather than fast tracking the process.

Thank you Scott and the PanAust team who attended and also stayed on to answer questions.


#### Placeholder: APNG Association AGM in late February
